


A very warm welcome to our open day! I'm incredibly proud to be Chancellor of Birmingham City University.



# How to write your personal statement

The personal statement is made up of three questions. When answering each question, you should demonstrate the things that make you a great candidate for your chosen course.

### The three core questions:

- Why do you want to study this course or subject?
- How have your qualifications and studies helped you prepare for this course or subject?
- What have you done to prepare outside of education, and why are these experiences useful?

### How to get started

Make a list or mind-map of your experiences in school and college, work, volunteering and extra-curricular activities. Think about which of these has taught you key skills you'll use at university. For example, did working on a presentation teach you to work independently? Or maybe being a part of your hockey team has taught you to work with others. Once you've got all your ideas on paper you can pick your favourites and see how they align to each of the questions.

### How much can I write?

The personal statement has a maximum character count of 4,000 across the three questions, which includes spaces. You don't have to use the same number of characters for each question, so you can write more for one than you do for the others.

### Top tips:

- The universities you apply to will review all three sections at the same time, so you don't need to repeat any information in different answers.
- Link back to your course. It's great to include examples of extracurricular activities or achievements in your personal statement, but make sure you explain how these relate back to the course you are applying for.
- Give evidence. Give evidence for all your claims don't just say you have good organisational skills, provide an example of how you can demonstrate it.
