


Writing your UCAS application and Personal Statement

BASED ON OUR CAMPUS, YEAR 11, 12 AND 13 STUDENTS ARE OFFERED THE CHANCE TO EXPERIENCE SEVERAL DIFFERENT WORKSHOPS OVER THE COURSE OF ONE DAY, TO BROADEN THEIR UNDERSTANDING OF THE DIFFERENT COURSES AVAILABLE IN EACH AREA.

ART. DESIGN AND MEDIA

20 November 2019

10.30am - 4pm

Explore the GothicStudents will participate in an interactive session in which they will

discuss and take part in exercises relating to the Gothic genre. They will also consider cultural context, literary predecessors and ethical questions related specifically to Frankenstein.


