When acting as the State-under-Review during the UPR, domestic governments could benefit greatly from engaging with CSOs

This factsheet sets out five key points for governments to consider actioning

Education and Training

Take part in education and training on the
UPR and implementation of
recommendations, supported by existing
materials and NHRIs

Collaborative Mechanisms Establish ongoing mechanisms for collaborations with CSOs, including regular forums, working groups, and advisory committees

Public Consultations

Hold regular public consultations in relation to the different stages of the UPR process

Implementation Tracking

Consider developing tracking tools to support implementation of UPR recommendations, including databases and NMIRFs

Socialising Laws and Policies

Work with CSOs to ensure new laws and policies are 'socialised' ensuring the general public are aware of them
