Pre-Recruitment Survey – Count Me In!

Content of the Activity:

Research Statement (50-100 words):

This is the pre-recruitment survey that will be sent to final year undergraduate students (UG), postgraduate taught students (PGT) and postgraduate research students (PGR). The aim of the survey is to gather basic demographic information, educational and subject specific information, and preferences for how individuals may wish to participate in the other planned fieldwork activities. For example we should be able to gather key information about ethnicity and nationality, subject area and faculty, employment, household income and support, as well as if they would like to participate online, offline, on campus or elsewhere if face to face.

Likewise if they prefer discussing via interview or focus groups, and which areas of the PGR experience or process they are most interested in talking about. A unique identifier along with a contact email will be taken. This will allow us to contact people for opportunities to participate, keep personal information separate from identifiable information, and link data across the different areas of fieldwork. Whilst the aim is for participants to fill this in first, they could still participate in other groups if approached, and fill this in afterwards to provide useful demographic information.

WHAT IS THIS RESEARCH ABOUT?

That's Me! Eliminating barriers to postgraduate research study in the West Midlands is a project that aims to explore the Global Majority postgraduate research experience, from applying for to being awarded a doctorate. The project is organised into three streams: Routes In, Routes Through, and Routes Out of study. Using research methods including focus groups, interviews, and arts based methods, we want to identify and address the challenges associated with postgraduate research, and so make positive changes to the research culture and community. These changes will benefit both universities and employers in the region. This project is co-led by Birmingham City University and the University of Wolverhampton. It is funded by the UKRI and Office of Students as part of a nationwide programme to widen participation in postgraduate research.

As part of the project, we are seeking to gather information from the That's Me! Employer Board. The aim of this is to understand how employees undertaking doctoral qualifications are supported and to also ascertain the perceived benefits and challenges of this study. That's Me! supports those from global majority backgrounds; therefore, we are specifically interested in collating information for this group.

There will be both closed questions (to help us gather statistical data) and open questions so that you can share your thoughts.

Global majority is a shortened version of the term 'people of the global majority'. We use it to refer to all ethnic groups except white British and other white groups, including white minorities. This includes people from black, Asian, mixed, and other ethnic groups who are often racialised as 'ethnic minorities'.

Design and delivery:

For surveys:

The survey instrument is available in Appendix A. This survey is expected to be live for data collection between 01/03/2024 to 31/03/2024.

Location:

Online (QuestionPro)

Logistical Requirements:

The survey will be promoted via internal communication methods.

Delivery team:

This activity will be delivered collaboratively by two academic staff members and one postgraduate researcher as part of the Routes In Action Research Team. One team member will be responsible for creating, editing, launching, and monitoring the survey using QuestionPro. The other two members will lead on survey design and the preparation of ethical approval documentation.

Budget:

This activity will offer participants the opportunity to be entered into a £50 Lovetoshop prize draw. Participants who are then part of later research stages will be compensated as part of the project standard incentive.

A postgraduate researcher is a student enrolled on a formal course at a university which focuses on the student completing an extended research project. Examples of qualifications postgraduate researchers may be enrolled on include MRes, MPhil and PhD.

DO I HAVE TO TAKE PART

It is up to you to decide whether or not to take part. You do not have to take part if you do not want to.

WHAT WILL MY INVOLVEMENT BE?

Your involvement is completing the survey.

HOW DO I WITHDRAW FROM THE STUDY?

You are free to withdraw within three months of participating without giving a reason by emailing us with your Unique ID, or completion receipt number issued to you upon completion of the survey. You will not be expected to disclose any personal or confidential information unless you choose to leave contact details. Withdrawing from the study will have no effect on you. If you withdraw from the study, we will aim to not retain the information you have given thus far, unless you are happy for us to do so.

WHAT WILL MY INFORMATION BE USED FOR?

We will use the collected information for training materials, project publicity, and research and policy publications produced as part of this project. Access to records from this study will be kept as confidential as possible. Only authorised members of the That's Me! Project team will have access to records. Your data will be anonymised: your name will not be used in any reports or publications resulting from the study. All digital files, transcripts, and summaries will be given codes and stored separately from any names or other direct identification of participants. Any hard copies of research information will be always kept in locked files. Limits to confidentiality: confidentiality will be maintained as far as it is possible, unless you tell us something which implies that you or someone you mention might be in significant danger of harm and unable to act for themselves; in this case, we may have to inform the relevant agencies of this, but we would discuss this with you first.
