<p>Home:</p>	<p>All students must be working in an appropriate environment in order to fully engage with the chosen modules.</p> <p>In addition Students undertaking clinical subject pathway modules will normally have a minimum of six months post registration experience for that speciality.</p> <p>LEVEL 6 STUDY</p> <p>A BSc degree is awarded on completion of 300 credits of which at least 60 must be at Level 6 or above. At least 100 of these credits must be studied at BCU for the student to be eligible for a BCU award. Students who have a Dip.HE. or equivalent from BCU will need to complete 60 credits at Level 6 to gain their BSc.</p> <p>Students who have a Dip HE or equivalent but do not have any previous BCU credits will need to complete at least 100 credits to gain a BSc award. These 100 credits can be achieved by completing five 20 credit modules at Level 6 or by completing three modules at Level 6 plus a 40 credit Level 5 portfolio module. The portfolio module is offered free of charge</p> <p>LEVEL 7 STUDY</p> <p>For entry into the Post Graduate Certificate students must have a relevant Bachelor's degree or equivalent or a 60 credit Level 6 award in an appropriate subject area. 14	Course Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
	<p>The underlying principle of the learning, teaching and assessment strategy for the Professional Practice Course focuses on the relationship between theory and practice, highlighting the importance of the links between relevant, contemporary evidence based theory and your practice in the delivery of high quality health care.</p> <p>The course aims to enable you to be a creative, confident and forward-thinking practitioner who is competent, well informed, takes an evidenced-based approach to practice, and prepared for the rapidly evolving world of modern health care practice. The course's teaching team are experts in their fields and passionate about sharing their knowledge and experience.</p> <p>You will be expected to engage with the course in terms of attending taught sessions, participating in learning activities both online and in the classroom, engaging in self-directed study and problem solving, accessing the learning resources and support available both at the university and in the workplace as well as engaging with formative and summative assessments. You are encouraged to share experiences and learn from each other as well as from your lecturers and to be fully involved in all aspects of the course.</p> <p>Reflection and self-awareness are key components of clinical practice and will be further developed throughout your study as it is acknowledged that you are an adult learner and as such bring with you a rich source of relevant learning and experience. A student-centred approach is encouraged where you are expected to identify your own strengths and weaknesses and fully participate in the variety of learning experiences on offer. You are encouraged to plan your own work schedules and are required to meet deadlines.</p> <p>A varied range of learning and teaching approaches are used throughout the modules and course to cater for the wide variety of students who access the course. A blended delivery utilising face to face and online resources is used in many of the modules, to accommodate different learning needs and to allow for more in-depth self-directed study as well as specific directed study and shared learning opportunities within the classroom and beyond. Some modules are available in an online format only.</p>

16 Overall Student Workload and Balance of Assessment
