

ART, DESIGN AND MEDIA

Architecture

Explore Architecture
Whole day

Students will take part in several taster sessions that reflect the creative studio environment within Architecture. These activities utilise cross-disciplinary skill sets such as abstract form generation techniques, sketch work, structural exploration and model making. These sessions are designed to reflect the course disciplines including Architecture, Interior Architecture and Design as well as Landscape Architecture and Urban Design.

Art

Explore Image Making
Whole day

Create and explore a range of image making techniques within the School of Art utilising heat press, print, synotype and photography to create new types of imagery.

Explore Abstract Sculpture Whole day Students will create their own abstract form and be taken to different stations throughout the School of Art to experiment with transforming their form using interdisciplinary approaches, utilising photography lighting, print as well as other art forms.

English

Explore the Gothic Whole day

Students will participate in an interactive session in which they will discuss and take part in exercises relating to the gothic genre.

Explore Creative Writing Whole day Published writers and practitioners will introduce your students to studying creative writing at university. Depending on which writer leads the class, students will understand key ideas and test their own creative practice in an interactive sessions on such genres as poetry, fiction and film.

Fashion and Textiles

Explore Textiles: Print and Pattern Half day A hands-on print workshop experience in our fabulous Parkside Building facility where students will have the opportunity to produce their own unique printed designs to take home.

Explore FashionTEX: Design and Make Whole day A one-day multiple workshop experience offering a taster of all the courses on offer across our Fashion and Textiles subjects. Students will get hands-on with materials and processes in our fabulous studios and workshops in The Parkside Building and learn from our creative community of lecturers, technicians, and student ambassadors. Students will work collaboratively through a sustainable upcycling design, make and promotion challenge.

Explore Sustainable Textiles

Half day

A hands-on textile workshop experience in our fabulous Parkside Building facility where students will have the opportunity to learn and apply sustainable design practice.

Jewellery

Explore Jewellery, Gemmology and Horology

Whole day

Students will make a piece of jewellery using traditional jewellery techniques. They will be introduced to the wonderful world of wearable art as jewellery through the exploration of materials, scale, wearability, concept, techniques and technology. They can discover what makes a clock tick, how clocks tell time, why they are designed the way they are, and what stops them from working. Students will finally learn to tell the difference between rare, valuable common and even fake gemstones through the study of gemmology.



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Media and Journalism

Explore Media and Journalism

Whole day

Have your students ever thought about becoming a presenter? Immerse your students in a day of production and find out what it's like to be a media student at university. Become a reporter, presenter or social media influencer as we offer your students a series of workshops focusing on various forms of media including television, journalism, and music business.

Product Design

Explore Product Design Whole day

Product and Furniture Design focuses on the design and development of creative, contemporary, sustainable and innovative products and furniture. During this Explore Day, staff will deliver a short talk introducing Product Design at undergraduate level - including exemplary projects from current students and discussing the diverse range of opportunities available within this industry. Students will then participate in a day of practical sessions that reflect the nature of working in a creative studio environment. These sessions foster cross-disciplinary skill sets including abstract form generation techniques, sketch work, structural exploration and model making. As part of this Explore Day, we can also offer portfolio reviews and a tour of the workshops and facilities.



Visual Communication

Explore Visual Communication and Photography

Whole day

Explore Visual Communication

Whole day

Your students will be introduced to what graphic communication is, how students work in illustration and what it takes to be a good photographer. Students will learn about working in the sector and see our excellent facilities first hand.

Your students will be introduced to visual communication, encompassing three distinct practice areas: illustration, graphic design and photography. This day will provide them with an understanding of how these areas contribute to the industry and an opportunity to see our exceptional facilities first-hand. To gain practical experience, they will undertake a small-scale collaborative poster project that combines elements from all the areas presented that will be Risograph printed and ready to take away on the day.

BUSINESS, LAW AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

Accounting, Finance and Economics

Explore Accounting, Finance and Economics

Whole day

Are your students interested in careers in the financial sector? Students will learn from industry professionals about the fields of accounting, finance and economics and will explore the career opportunities each presents. Interactive, engaging sessions will provide practical experience and students will have the opportunity to visit our City Trading Room and take part in a campus tour.

Business, Marketing and Management

Explore Business, Marketing and Management

Whole day

With so many business degrees offered at university, it can be confusing to know what's what. For your students considering business careers, this event will showcase a variety of key subjects and students will leave with a deeper understanding of business courses. Students will take part in interactive, thought-provoking sessions delivered by our academics, from looking into the importance of digital content marketing, to recruiting well using sustainable HR policies.

Law

Explore Law in Practice

Whole day

Explore Law in Practice is an event for students to gain and deepen understanding of the legal sector and studying law at university. Students will hear from legal practitioners and academics and will engage in interactive sessions to increase their knowledge of the sector and practice key legal skills. Students will have a tour of our City Centre Campus, including our very own mock courtrooms and Law Clinic.

Psychology

Explore Psychology
Whole day

Through engaging and interactive sessions, students are invited to delve into the diverse branches of psychology, unlocking insights into human behaviour and thought processes. This immersive experience encourages students to explore the practical applications of psychological concepts in real life. Whether it's unravelling the mysteries of the mind or understanding the dynamics of human interactions, Explore Psychology promises an enriching and thought-provoking day for your students.

Social Sciences

Explore Social Sciences

Whole day

With help from our social sciences academics, students will develop an insight into society to try and understand our modern world. Sessions could range from cybercrime, sociological perspectives of music or psychology talks on how to study the brain, to a debate on the use of force in the police. Interactive and engaging, this will increase students' understanding and demonstrate what studying social sciences at university could be like. Content can be negotiated at point of booking.



COMPUTING, ENGINEERING AND THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT

Built Environment

Explore Property and Construction

Whole day

This session introduces students to careers in the built environment industries, from designing buildings and choosing materials to costing and managing the materials. Also students will learn about the people needed to make those buildings happen in a sustainable and profitable way, to inspecting, valuing and trading in property. Students will get involved in discussion and practical taster activities specifically focusing on old and new buildings, design, construction, conservation and business.

Computing

Explore Computing and IT

Whole day

Individuals and organisations rely more than ever on complex computer systems, networks and software platforms and use data to inform decision making, and the day will highlight a number of theses areas. On this day, students get involved in some interesting hands-on activities focused on areas such as computer networks, cyber security, databases and programming.

Explore Digital and Gaming Tech

Whole day

Students discover the many opportunities open to them with a degree in sound, gaming or film and learn many key skills they will need to find a place in the ever-growing world of computer-based creative design.

Engineering

Explore Engineering Whole day

This session will highlight the modern advances in engineering in the second decade of the 21st Century. We will highlight the importance of engineering and how it helps to sustain and grow the local, national and the global economy. Students will have the opportunity to undertake an interactive session in the engineering workshop and explore different aspects of engineering from conceptual design, prototyping and manufacturing through to volume production. They can also find out more about the Formula Student race car that BCU students design and manufacture from scratch in less than six months.

HEALTH, EDUCATION AND LIFE SCIENCES

Nursing

Explore Nursing

Whole day

Your students can discover what it is like to be a nurse on our interactive Explore Day. Students will have the opportunity to become immersed in each of our four fields of nursing: adult, child, learning disability and mental health. Students will learn more about how we work with our healthcare professionals and what studying to be a nurse is like.

Biomedical Engineering

Explore Biomedical Engineering

Whole day

This session introduces students to careers in the biomedical engineering field, including designing prosthetics, research and development in the healthcare technology industry and clinical engineering opportunities in the NHS. Students will get involved in discussion and practical taster activities specifically focusing on biomedical engineering and its applications.

Biomedical Sciences

Explore Biomedical Sciences

Whole day

This event will showcase our leading biomedical laboratories, giving your students the opportunity to experience the skills required to operate in this environment. With a negotiable programme, some of the topics that can be delivered include urinalysis, lab essentials and haemoglobin determination spectrophotometry.

Childhood and Community

Explore Childhood, Youth and Communities

Whole day

Whether your students want to work in early years, education or with vulnerable children and families, we have a course that's right for them. This carousel-style event will allow them to explore the differences between our programmes while experiencing our state-of-the-art teaching facilities. Your students can discover what a career in challenging yet rewarding situations is really like, working in ways that promote equality, diversity and social justice, as well as making a real difference to people's lives.



Conductive Education

Explore Conductive Education

Whole day

This event is designed to give students the opportunity to find out more about conductive education, which is an educational approach to working with children and adults who experience movement difficulties. Students will learn more about the course itself, which comes with Qualified Conductor Status, enabling the successful student to work both in the UK and internationally in the field of special education needs and disabilities.

Diagnostic and Therapeutic Radiography

Explore Radiography
Half day

Offering a combination of both academic and life skills sessions, this event aims to develop students' understanding of these clinical areas. Students will take part in a carousel of workshop activities and will also have the opportunity to tour our fantastic learning facilities, such as our x-ray scanning room and Virtual Environment for Radiotherapy Training (VERT).

Education


Explore EducationWhole day

Whether your students want to work in primary education, secondary education or even supporting those with neurological disorders in education, we have a course that's right for them. This carousel-style event will allow them to explore the differences between our various education programmes while experiencing our state-of-the-art teaching facilities.

Sport

Explore Sport Whole day

Our Explore Sport event gives students the opportunity to take part in highly interactive workshops relating to therapy, environmental physiology, principles of training, skills acquisition and biomechanics. Students will experience our leading facilities and be taught by our own leading academics who still regularly work within the world of sport at both grassroots and elite level.





ART, DESIGN AND MEDIA

Acting

Introduction to Applied Theatre: Drama with a Purpose

2.5 hours

This workshop will be a fun and practical introduction to Applied Theatre – delivered at the Royal Birmingham Conservatoire. The workshop is targeted at students interested in pursuing acting, directing, playwriting and producing careers. During the session, students will explore why we make 'theatre with a purpose' and how we engage schools and communities in making the work. Through drama exercises and ensemble skills development, we will explore some of the ways our students work to create original and important new theatre.

Animation

Keyframes and In-betweens

1-3 hours

In this workshop we will explore the simple principle behind animation. Working on A3 paper grids, with each rectangle representing a single frame, students will create a 4 second animation. Animators work using keyframes. An image sequence that creates the illusion of smooth movement and life are placed in between the keyframe. This sequence of images are called the 'in-betweens'. This workshop will allow students to practically and very rapidly see how these in-betweens work, and how much you will need to change the next image to create smooth animated movements. This workshop allows students to work on paper but easily see the results of animated drawings instantaneously. As we progress, we create a collaborative animation that grows before your eyes.

English

Shakespeare: A complete introduction

2 hours

This masterclass explores aspects of Shakespeare's life and writing to offer students a university-style study of a selected play and the ways which we can engage with it as both text and performance.

A Recipe for a Poet

2 hours

2 hours

A masterclass focused on poetry – both how we read it and how we write it. Led by both published poets and literary critics, students will develop techniques for both writing and reading verse.

Post-colonial Masterclass This masterclass explores key postcolonial theories and considers the ways that we can adapt them to our reading and analysis of texts taught on the current syllabi.

Shakespertise™

1-2 hours

Led by Professor David Roberts, National Teaching Fellow and author of Games for English Literature, this masterclass involves a new and innovative card game based on Shakespeare's plays that is both fun and equips students with key knowledge, perfect for revision!



Fashion and Textiles

Master Hand Weaving 3 hours

A hands-on workshop experience in our fabulous Parkside Building facility where students will be introduced to hand weaving on our table top looms.

Film and Photography

It Doesn't Have to Move to be a Film

2-3 hours

Using your own phone camera, you will be asked to create a 10-shot film sequence that copies markers technique. We will explore how image sequence and visual story create narrative. By the end of the workshop you will present your 10-shot film. You will understand how image sequence can create dramatic stories. This workshop will also show you the things that film and photography share, and the things that make them different.



Film

Film - Lens Compression Masterclass

2 hours

Get to grips with lens language. How we see the world in cinema is dependent upon the lens. The focal length of a lens changes how a subjects looks within their surrounds. In this practical workshop, using cinema prime lenses within a studio set-up, we will show you how lens choice tells a story about the subject. We will explore how lens choice tells its own visual story.

180 Degree Rule and Crossing the Line

1-3 hours

A technique filmmakers use is the '180 degree rule'. This rule helps us make it seem as if the actors are looking at each other and relating to each other. 'Crossing the line' is breaking that rule. Crossing the line can have a disastrous effect on the believability of a scene with dialogue. In a studio set-up, we will explore the 180 degree rule and when 'crossing the line' and breaking the rule might be a good thing.

Gemmology

Gemmology Detectives

1.5 hours

A short talk about gemstone properties and how gemmological equipment aids identification. This is a hands-on workshop where participants will work with BCU gemmologists whilst using a range of testing equipment. Each test performed will enable separation and gemstone identification. These workshops will focus on relevant concepts that the students are working on and apply it to the world of gemmology.

Jewellery

Jewellery Making Masterclass

1-3 hours

Create a piece of jewellery within our historic School of Jewellery. Students will make a piece of jewellery using traditional jewellery techniques, including shaping, filing and soldering metal. The masterclass can be altered to fit your curriculum. Numbers between 6-12 per session.

Media and Journalism

Podcasting and Vlogging

2 hours

Each week seven million people listen to podcasts in the UK and, the beauty is, virtually anyone can start one. But how do you do it? In this session your students will learn what a podcast is and consider how to turn their idea into one that people will love. Your students will understand how to define target audiences, as well as deciding what will go into their podcast and, once it's made, how to distribute and market it.

Photography

Light up the Studio

2 hours

Come and explore our four amazing studios. We can offer a 2–3-hour session within our studios shooting portraits in various lighting settings including high keys and low keys. Use our colourrama to shoot creative fashion and portrait shots and use a product space with a range of unique lighting modifiers and projectors. All studio times will be tethered so you can see your photographs come on screen live.

Explore the Dark Room

2 hours

Join us in our processing and darkroom. Our darkroom workshop can offer an induction into the darkroom with photograms and Cyanotypes or further work with processing film and printing from negatives.



Product Design

Structural Exploration and Model Making

2 hours

Within this masterclass, students will participate in a practical exploratory session that reflects the nature of working in a creative studio environment, tasked with exploring the creative possibilities of structural investigation as a generative method in design. Considerations will encompass material properties and manipulation, structural elements, visual aesthetics, stability, weight, and fastenings. This activity will incorporate cross-disciplinary skill sets including abstract form generation techniques, sketch work, structural exploration and model making. As part of this session, we will also showcase examples of various projects created by students on our course and discuss the various opportunities that this industry offers.

Visual Communication

Riso Printing Masterclass

2 hours

In this workshop, you will learn to create high-quality, two-colour prints using the Risograph digital/mechanical silkscreen process. You will discover practical techniques for working with textures, lines, and typography and take away a beautiful print you make on the day.

BUSINESS, LAW AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

Finance

Portfolio Investment

2 hours

Portfolio investment involves strategically crafting a mix of financial assets to achieve specific goals while managing risk. Key elements include aligning strategy with goals, assessing risk tolerance, strategic asset allocation, and selecting investment vehicles like stocks, bonds, and mutual funds. At the end of the session, students will be equipped with fundamental knowledge and practical insights to begin navigating portfolio investment and making informed decisions to meet their financial objectives. Our academic gives a live demonstration by downloading data from Refinitiv Eikon and constructing equity portfolio using our trading room at BCU.

Law

Practical Courtroom Skills

2 hours

This session aims to introduce students to a range of courtroom practices and procedures in an engaging, hands-on manner. The workshop will involve students taking on a number of roles including magistrate, defendant, solicitor and legal advisor in a range of legal scenarios.



COMPUTING, ENGINEERING AND THE BUILT ENVIRONMENT

Engineering

Electric Vehicles -Engineering the Future of Transport

3 hours

As the climate continues to change at a rapid pace, demand for electric vehicles (EVs) has soared. Our engineers are working hard to ensure that these EVs are safe and reliable as they help us reduce our dependency on fossil fuels. This masterclass explores electric vehicles in more detail and delves further into transport's future.

Games Design

Games Design: An Introduction

2 hours

A masterclass covering the basics of games design beginning with a 30-minute presentation covering courses and the basic principles of games design and development, also outlining the various disciplines involved. Followed by a 60-minute practical workshop where students will use practical materials (paper, pens, dice and counters etc) to solve a games design problem set at the end of the presentation. The last half an hour will be the students presenting their board game solutions and receiving feedback from our expert academics.



HEALTH. EDUCATION AND LIFE SCIENCES

Biomedical Engineering

Do you know how Technology Interacts with the Human Body?

2 hours

This session covers basic engineering concepts through state-of-the-art technology used to benefit healthcare. Students will be able to see the biomechanical aspects of the human bone and examine its load-bearing ability. Students will also be able to witness the extent to which computers interface with the human body via specific software and/or electro-mechanical devices, and enable one to process and reconstruct various bones and joints in our body.

Social Work

Social Work Masterclass

2 hours

In this session you will have the opportunity to be immersed in the role of an adult and children's social worker and learn about how social workers work with different professionals as well as what it is like to be a social worker.

TALKS AND WORKSHOPS

We offer a series of talks that provide a closer look at individual courses, giving students in years 11, 12 and 13 an overview of contemporary topics and research. This allows them to develop a deeper understanding of current issues within their chosen subject area.
