

- PGCE (14 to 19) in Social Science: Psychology, Sociology and Health and Social Care
- Undergraduate BA/BSc (Hons) with QTS in Physical Education and Science (Biology).

ITT MENTOR TRAINING 2025/26

Mentoring Support

BCU provides both online and in-person mentor training and support for all our school-based mentors. 'Brightspace' is used as an online platform for delivering asynchronous mentor training modules that can be completed at a time convenient to our mentors and additional mentor training and support will also be provided during school visits from a member of our BCU Lead Mentor team and during online synchronous training sessions.

Please note that the initial 20-hour mentor training requirement originally published by the DfE last year is no longer required (as of November 2024). The ITT Criteria published by the DfE (2024) requires that ITT Mentors need to understand the Associate Teachers' ITT curriculum, the relevant research base which informs it and their role in supporting its implementation. It also states that ITT Mentors will need to ensure that school-based training experiences are aligned to the ITT curriculum and that Associate Teachers have opportunities for purposeful practice in relation to key concepts and high-quality feedback.

In light of these requirements from the DfE and in recognising the retraction of the set number of training hours, BCU's mentor training provision has been designed to provide the most appropriate level of support and training required for new mentors, existing mentors and our most experienced mentors.

Full details of how to access online mentor training and relevant dates will be shared with school mentors prior to start of the next academic year and once placement allocations are confirmed.



TEACHING COMMITMENTS

Undergraduate

Year 1

Building to one individual teaching hour a day.

Year 1

Building from 5 to 10 individual teaching hours each week.

Year 3

Building to teaching 80% of a full-time teacher's timetable towards the end of the placement as appropriate to the school's curriculum and timetable.

Postgraduate

Placement 1 (October - February)

Build up to 7 hours individual teaching hours each week of classes across KS3/4.

Placement 2 (February to June)

Building to teaching 80% of a full-time teacher's timetable towards the end of the placement as appropriate to the school's curriculum and timetable.



BCU ITE CURRICULUM

The ITE BCU curriculum is cyclical in nature to enable content to be learnt, revisited and applied. Our PGCE and Undergraduate Associate Teachers will experience this across their three year course.

The spiral curriculum is not simply the repetition of any topic taught. It also requires the deepening of it, with each successive encounter building on the previous one. Each module within the Secondary ITE Curriculum ensures that associate teachers acquire research-led pedagogical and curriculum knowledge, and moreover, develop a clear insight into how to implement this knowledge as they develop their teaching skills with the support of expert colleagues across the BCU regional partnership.

BCU Core Curriculum Themes ensure that BCU Associate Teachers:

- A. Associate teacher uses critical enquiry and research informed practice to develop their understanding of effective teaching and learning.
- B. Associate teacher's classroom practice establishes effective behaviour management using high expectations and awareness of pupil wellbeing.
- C. Associate teacher knows more, remembers more and applies subject knowledge and subject-specific pedagogy to impact on pupils' progress.
- D. Associate Teacher uses knowledge about how pupils learn to plan and assess learning to ensure that all pupils make progress.
- E. Associate Teacher implements effective adaptive teaching approaches to meet all learners' needs, including SEND (Special Educational Needs and Disability) and EAL (English as an Additional Language) learners.
- F. Associate Teacher demonstrates professional behaviours and contributes effectively to the wider life of the school.



INTENSIVE TRAINING AND PRACTICE (ITAP)

During the 2025/26 academic year, our postgraduate and undergraduate curricula will feature four Intensive Training and Practice (ITaP) weeks. The four topics will encompass Behaviour: Rules, Routines, and Relationships; Inclusive Teaching; Language in Your Subject; and Assessment. Each area, is framed by key questions designed to help our Associate Teachers (ATs) develop a critical and enquiring mindset. They will first explore these professional issues broadly before considering their specific application within their subject.

Each ITaP is structured around Grossman's (2018) framework: introduce, analyse, prepare, enact, and assess. For our PGCE ATs, this will be delivered as a dedicated week within their curriculum, while undergraduate ATs will engage in a strategically sequenced series of days spread across multiple weeks. As we continue to develop and enhance these sessions, our tutor team remains committed to supporting ATs in practising evidence-informed strategies, observing expert practitioners, and receiving constructive feedback to refine their teaching skills.

We highly value collaboration across our partnership, so if you or your colleagues are interested in contributing to the planning or delivery of ITaP sessions, please reach out. We look forward to working together to support the development of our Associate Teachers.



PLACEMENT PAYMENTS

BCU will pay schools the amount listed in the table per placement. The ITT Criteria (2024) requires that every Associate Teacher receives 1.5 hours per week of mentoring support. This payment is a contribution to the school for the weekly mentor support (including ITaPs).

Undergraduate

Year 1 - 30 days = £550

Year 2 - 40 days = £450 Year 3 - 60 days = 750

Year 1 paired placement = £1,200



School 1 = £500 School 2 = £800

Gratuity Payments

5 or more Associate Teachers = £250 10 or more Associate Teachers = £600

Payments will be made in the term after the school-based placement is completed and payments will be made electronically into your school's bank account when the relevant documentation is submitted (this includes a completed and signed End of Placement Report for each Associate Teacher and completion of the online mentor survey). Please note that for Associate Teachers whose time on placement comes to an end before the midpoint assessment, a prorata payment will be paid to the school based on the number of placement days completed. If an Associate Teacher's placement ends after the midpoint assessment, the full amount will still be paid.



All our school partners are registered on our Placement Communication Portal 'PCP'. PCP facilitates communication with you as our partner schools. You will make offers of placements through the portal and be able to view all Associate Teacher details in one central place. The portal offers benefits that will make the administration of school placements more straightforward for you as partners in school. After the launch of this portal in the current academic year, partners have found this very helpful to support them in managing placements.

The portal offers:

- a central record of all Associate Teacher details and their assigned classes/subject and mentors
- an easy way to access Letters of Assurance for each Associate Teacher whenever needed
- a simple overview of all placement offers made to keep track of upcoming placements
- an easy-to-access repository of all the necessary information needed to support placements, with links to mentor training and all necessary placement documents
