#### **RESEARCH WITH IMPACT**

#### 'Traffic light' till receipts

Researchers in our Faculty of Health, Education and Life Sciences have devised a 'traffic light' system which uses till receipts to display the total data for calories, sugar, fat and salt in a person's entire shop, with a green, amber or red verdict on the basket as a whole, as opposed to individual items.

#### Visualising medical parts

Researchers at our Digital Media Technology Lab are developing a system which allows medical practitioners to view and interact with virtual replicas of patients' organs, bones or body parts. The system could also be used to demonstrate procedures or the effects of lifestyle choices such as healthy eating or smoking to patients.

#### MONEY. FEES AND GRANTS

Information on the relevant fees for each course can be found on our website at www.bcu.ac.uk/courses. The good news is that most students do not have to pay tuition fees up front and there are a range of funding options available to support you.

Loans are available to cover the full cost of your tuition fees and there are also loans for living expenses, such as accommodation and travel. You start to pay the student loan back once you are in work and earning above a set threshold, set to increase to £25,000 in 2018.

Loans are subject to conditions and arrangements may change in future, depending on government legislation. There are also non-repayable grants available for some students with disabilities, students who are parents or who have an adult who is financially dependent on them, or students in receipt of certain benefits.

To welcome all new home and EU undergraduate students starting in 2019/20, we're giving at least £150 worth of credit to spend in a host of ways, on books and a range of learning materials. Even better, it doesn't have to be repaid!
