Birmingham City University students will:

- Actively engage with learning opportunities, including attendance at academic sessions and placements
- Meet all academic deadlines, or inform the University if you can't
- Give feedback on your academic and student experience
- Understand and abide by University regulations, policies and procedures
- Keep your University records and emergency contact details up to date
- Use the appropriate processes to inform the University if you are unable to engage in your course
- Seek out and engage with academic and pastoral support services when you need them
- Respect University and Students' Union resources and facilities
- Recognise and value others' different identities, life experiences, and cultural backgrounds, helping to foster a welcoming and inclusive environment for all

Birmingham City University will:

- Deliver a high quality, inclusive, and stimulating learning experience to help you succeed
- Provide consistent academic and personal support, including from a personal tutor or supervisor
- Ensure access to learning resources, study spaces, and opportunities for placement, internship, study abroad and volunteering
- Respond to communication in a timely, student-centred manner aim to resolve issues quickly
- Offer accessible, inclusive student support services and advice
- Support your transition to BCU and between years of study with induction and reorientation sessions
- Mark assessments fairly and provide constructive feedback
- Share clear, accurate, and timely course information
- Offer career and employability advice and opportunities, including for enterprise and self-employment activities
- Publish clear processes for reporting and responding to harmful behaviours
- Foster a tolerant, inclusive environment that upholds freedom of speech

- Represent and amplify the student voice both locally and nationally
- Ensure you receive fair treatment and make you aware of your rights and responsibilities
- Provide independent, confidential advice on academic and welfare issues
- Enable democratic elections for student leadership and advocacy

- Offer societies, activities and experiences to enrich your social life and your CV
- Provide social spaces for relaxation and connection
- Collaborate with the University to deliver an outstanding student experience that is impactful, diverse, inclusive, and engaging for all
